The main aim of the Copenhagen Associations Project is to investigate the private associations of the Classical, Hellenistic and Roman worlds (c. 500 BCE to c. AD 200). The prime geographical area covered extends from Italy to India. The project also seeks to elucidate their contribution to the development of contemporary societies. Two subsidiary aims are: (a) to examine possible connections to, and influences on, allegedly similar phenomena in other areas and historical periods; and (b) to re-evaluate current scholarly perceptions about distinctions between the public, private, and sacred spheres.
